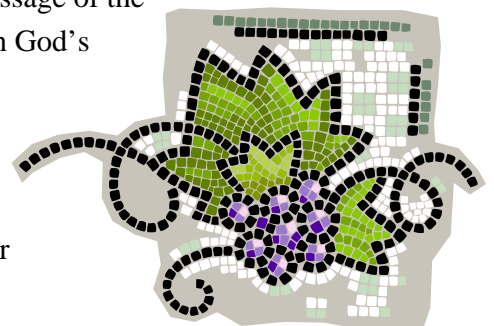

The Churchwide Coordinating Team's Justice and Peace Committee is working to help PW become knowledgeable about the Millennium Development Goals adopted in 2000. It is hoped that the 8 goals will be achieved by 2015. The goals are as follows:

1. Eradicate extreme poverty and hunger
2. Achieve universal primary education
3. Promote gender equality and empower women
4. Reduce child mortality
5. Improve maternal health
6. Combat HIV/AIDS, malaria and other diseases
7. Ensure environmental sustainability
8. Develop a Global Partnership for Development

New PW *HORIZONS* Bible Study for 2008-09

Jubilee! Luke's Gospel for the Poor by Dale Lindsay Morgan. In the nine lessons of this study, the author highlights Jesus' message of jubilee: "...he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor... to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free..." Learn about the many ways that Christ's jubilee message turned the world upside down, exalting the poor and including outsiders, bringing the love of God to ALL. There are many resources available for this study, including:

- * *Eyewitness News: Transcripts of Live Interviews with Those Who Saw Jesus* – Fictional interviews with those who witnessed Jesus' healings, teachings and miracles.
- * *Out of the Abundance of the Heart: A Jubilee Journal* – The author has created a journal to be used to tell of Jesus' long journey to Jerusalem. Could be used during Lent or the 40 weeks of the Bible Study.
- * *On the Road: A Storytelling Journey with Luke* – Kikanza Nuri Robins has created this workbook to help participants understand how they and others experience inclusion and exclusion, privilege and powerlessness.

Milwaukee Group Supports Ugandan Grandmothers

Grandmothers don't often expect to raise their grandchildren, but in Africa, where the AIDS epidemic has killed the parents of thousands of children, it happens too frequently. But a group in Milwaukee is doing what they can to help. Called *Grandmothers Beyond Borders*, and only a little more than 2 years old, the organization is building relationships with grandmothers who are raising grandchildren in Uganda, increasing awareness of the impact of AIDS in Africa and working to improve the African grandmothers' standard of living. The organization describes itself as a volunteer, grass-roots effort, which started through the efforts of Amy Peterson of Milwaukee, who heard of the plight of Ugandan grandmothers through a National Public Radio broadcast. The origins are more fully described at the organization's Web site, www.grandmothersbeyond.com. All funds donated to *Grandmothers Beyond Borders* support the Ugandan grandmothers and grandchildren who have been affected by AIDS. Donations provide the basic necessities of raising children, including food, bedding, clothing, school supplies and school fees. Administrative costs are currently covered by donors and sponsoring organizations. Jerusalem Presbyterian Church, Wales, Wis., is actively participating in the program. The Grandmothers Beyond Borders group at the church recently worked on book bags that it will sell at the church's Donna Lexa Memorial Art Fair in August. All proceeds from the sale of the bags will go to *Grandmothers Beyond Borders*.

Synod of Lakes and Prairies PW Report

To: Synod of Lakes and Prairies Presbyterian Women Coordinating Team, PW Moderators, and Co-Moderators

Date: April 11, 2008

This is my 6th and last report to Presbyterian Women in the Lakes and Prairies Synod. I feel that I've done a good job these past three years but I also have that gnawing in the pit of my stomach wishing I could have done more. It's been almost a full time job; not a day has gone by that I haven't been doing something related to my work. My committee for three years has been Justice and Peace. The past two years the *Horizons* Bible Study was added to my duties and this past year I was the chairman of the Bible Study. I've written three articles for the *Horizons* magazine. Two have appeared over the past two years and the third one will be published sometime this summer.

The Churchwide Gathering planning teams had met in Louisville, Ky. Jan. 12-13, 2008. We previewed the new Gathering promotional packet and DVD. These items are now available from PDS 800-524-2612; item CWG-09-032. The packet is also available as a download from the PW Churchwide Gathering Web site, www.pcusa.org/pwgathering. The Gathering registration form will be available in the September/October issue of *Horizons*. The CWG 2009 logo won a 2008 Award of Excellence from the Religion Communicator's Council.

The Churchwide Coordinating Team met in Alexandria, Va., March 4-9, a summary follows:

- Catreli Hunter has stated that the Antiracism Task Group has become a CCT working committee. It will focus on actions that Presbyterian Women, individually and as a group can take to combat racism in their churches and communities.
- Ellen Newbold, chairman, asked that we vote to continue the *Blessings Without Boundaries Mission Pledge* Campaign. The new theme and the materials for the 2009-2112 triennium will be introduced at the 2009 Churchwide Gathering.
- Eveline Steele, chairman, tells us that a new, brief PW organizational overview piece is being created. The resource is being translated into Spanish, Korean, Taiwanese, Arabic, and Portuguese.
- **Margaret Welsh**, Chairman of the Bible Study Committee, reports that the author for the 2011-2012 *Horizons* Bible Study Committee will be Dr. Margaret Aymer Oget, which is on the Beatitudes. She lives in Atlanta, GA. The topic for the 2012-2013 Bible Study will be *Christian Community* as understood through the epistles.
- Polly Shafer, chairman of the Finance Committee gave this three year income comparison:

- Hagar Benitez, chairman of Justice and Peace reports that Presbyterian Women have signed up with the Good Deed foundation of the Women's Funding Network to promote simple acts about consumer actions that lift women and girls out of poverty. Soon, items with the Good Deed logo will be available in stores. Purchase of these items will provide funds for the 125 nonprofit organizations working to dismantle poverty or provide solutions to climate change. Visit www.GoodDeedFoundation.org/ for details.
- The Coalition of Immokalee Workers has launched a petition campaign calling on Burger King and other food industry leaders to work with the CIW to:
 - * pay a penny more per pound to farm workers harvesting tomatoes
 - * establish an enforceable, human rights based code of conduct to end modern day slavery and other abuses in the fields.
- Signers would indicate their intention to stop patronizing Burger King now and possibly other food industry leaders in the future. Petitions will be delivered in late spring to Burger King headquarters in Miami, Fla. in a peaceful action, so act now!
- For more, PW has received an update on Nestle, S.A., and its relations with cocoa farmers in West Africa. "Global confectioners Mars and Nestle have joined a sustainable cocoa program, which aims to establish a traceability program for all farmers in the Ivory Coast." - The CCT delegates gave reports on the 52nd Commission on the Status of Women. They have asked to become informed about the Millennium Development Goals, the Millennium Campaign, and Voices Against Poverty.
- Mission Relationships Committee, **Judia Foreman**, chairman:
 - * Information on *Bread for the World* and its *Offering of Letters* campaign will be placed on the Together in Service Web site, www.pcusa.org/pw/missionmatters/tis/.
 - * The committee encourages Presbyterian Women at all levels to purchase and read the daily *Mission Yearbook of Prayer and Study*.
 - * Palm Project: \$20,000 has been sent for purchase of palm trees to be planted in the Congo: another \$12,000 has been received for additional palm trees (money will be sent when \$20,000 has been received).
 - * Each MRC committee member will develop relationships with Mission Relationships SCT members in two assigned synods.
- The CCT attended the Ecumenical Advocacy Days event in Alexandria, Va. on Friday night, March 7 for open plenary and Sunday morning, March 9, for worship and workshops. Two of us, Judia Foreman and I, participated in Congressional visits on Monday, March 10 on Capitol Hill.
- On Saturday evening I did the devotions using our *Horizons* Bible Study and Ruth as the theme for being just an ordinary woman but called by God to do extraordinary tasks. We all fit into that category sometimes in our life. A party was given to the six of us who will no longer be on the CCT.

The next CCT meeting is Aug. 20-26, 2008 in the Minneapolis area, in the Synod of Lakes and Prairies.

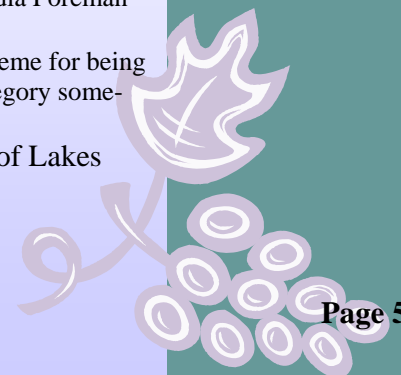
