Presbytery's New Moderator Begins Term

Lila Jean Jensen, member of the **First Presbyterian Church in Audubon**, is the new Presbytery moderator for 2006. Here is a brief synopsis of her life in Christ.

"My life began when I was born at home on my father's 25th birthday in Coon Rapids, Iowa. He was a John Deere dealer and my mother had been a teacher before she married him. After the wedding she became a full-

time dedicated homemaker and mother. We moved to Audubon in 1936 where my father continued his dealership while they added three more children to the family.

The church became important to me when I was confirmed at the age of 12 in the Audubon First Presbyterian Church, so I have been a member there for a very long time. So I

haven't moved around much, but I've traveled a great deal which is one of my favorite things to do.

After two years of college at the University of Northern Iowa in Cedar Falls, (then Iowa State Teachers College) I taught for two years before marriage took me to farm life where we had two children before my husband died of cancer.

CHANGE IN STANDARD MILEAGE RATE

Last September the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) took the unusual step of increasing the standard

mileage rate to \$.485 per mile until Dec. 31, 2005.

The IRS has now issued a **new rate of \$.445 per mile** for calendar year 2006. This is the rate used to calculate the amount per mile to be reimbursed to pastors for miles driven in their personal cars for the ministry of the church.

News Service Index Now Available

People who receive *Presbyterian News Service* (PNS) stories by e-mail will have an additional option in January — a weekly index of headlines with links to the full texts.

This new addition, adds to the current e-mail options, either: full texts of all stories, or “Headline News” — a three- or four-paragraph summary of the week’s top stories.

Of course, all PNS stories are also posted on the news service’s Web site: www.pcusa.org/pcnews. PNS publishes between 700 and 1,000 stories annually.

The new service was requested by the General Assembly Council’s Governance Task Force, whose key goals include better church-wide communication.

To choose, go to www.pcusa.org/pcnews, click on the “subscriptions” button, and follow the simple instructions.

All PNS services are free.

The new “news index” will be published every Friday, beginning Jan. 6, 2006.

years, such as nominations, women and the church, and education. Also, I was a counselor at our church camp for three years.

Right now I am active in the "Joining Hands Against Hunger" mission program and West Regional Partnership.

At the Synod level, we enjoy going to Synod School every year. It has helped me on my spiritual journey.

CRESTON BEGINS MISSION WORK IN MISSISSIPPI

The **Creston First Presbyterian Church's** session approved adopting the First Presbyterian Church of Pascagoula, Miss., as their sister church. In 2004, a fund raising

campaign was held for a new sanctuary in Creston. Now, the money raised will be added to the fall hurricane offering, totaling \$7,500.00, which will go to the Pascagoula church for their use.

The Creston church plans a long-term mission with the Pascagoula sister church in hopes of creative mission opportunities (i.e., re-supplying the kitchen with equipment). A Creston delegation will be sent to Pascagoula to see first hand what their needs are and to personally deliver the funds.

In January, a couple from the Creston congregation will travel to Gulf Port, Miss. Right now, Pascagoula is in need of skilled labor (carpenters, electricians, etc.), but Gulf Port is ready for less skilled labor. This may be an opportunity for future work groups to help, in fact the Creston youth group is looking to visit the gulf region this summer.

I am deeply grateful that with so many disasters this past year, Two Rivers selected CROSS Ministries as the recipient of the free will offering that evening.
